## Lake Tahoe Ski Area, Nevada January 12-21, 2008

No Change

...The Club flies into Reno on Saturday, 12 January and returns 9 days later on the MLK Monday, 21 January. We lodge for three nights in South Lake Tahoe at Lakeland Village and ski two days

at Heavenly Ski Resort.

...On our third full day, we cruise northbound across Lake Tahoe on the Tahoe Queen paddle wheeler to settle at Northstar-at-Tahoe for six nights lodging. On two days, we shuttle Squaw Val-

ley to ski. We ski three days at Northstar, where cross-country skiing is included in the lift ticket. Pre-trip add-ons: Arrive 2 days early to lodge at Sierra Club's Clair Tappaan Hut for cross country skiing at Donner Pass. Or fly to Reno after work Friday, 11 JAN, stay at the Sands, and ski Mt. Rose on Saturday until the club shows up.



...Heavenly has the best views of the Lake Tahoe, beginner terrain at the top of the Gondola, steep backwoods ♦♦, and the highest and longest runs at Tahoe. Our Lakeland lodging has frequent, free shuttles around town (including casinos). Northstar has the friendliest village, gentle terrain, the most terrain parks, easy woodsy runs with wildlife if you look. It's a good place to try cross country skiing or snowboarding. Notice the two lodging options at Northstar. Squaw Valley has The Best backside for Big Air launches when the powder is deep. Mt. Rose is the local Reno resort and has superb ♦♦ Chutes (new in '03) when the powder is deep. Some prices (including Air) for the 2007-2008 season are still estimates of 105% of this year's prices. ## **Bear Creek Day Trip** June 9, 2007

...The HSC will travel to Bear Creek, Tennessee, south of Russellville, for a canoe/kayak trip with your ski club friends and quests. 




